# SafeguardingMISFGM and Information SharingEngland

"Sharing information about FGM is vital to safeguard and promote the welfare of children and young people" (DH March 2015).

There are 3 requirements on NHS organisations for sharing information in relation to FGM

- FGM-IS
- FGM Mandatory Reporting Duty 2015
- FGM Enhanced dataset SCCI 2026



# What is The FGM IS and what does it do?



National web based system for sharing information, which:

- Highlights a family history of FGM to protect and safeguard a girl under 18
- Shares information on the record of a girl under 18
- Prompts clinicians treating a girl that she has a family history of FGM

The FGM tab is present on the Summary Care Application (SCRa), which is part of the NHS Spine for girls under the age of 18.



## FGM IS is part of Safeguarding Miss

The FGM IS:

- Does not change or replace professionals responsibility
- Is used alongside existing local and national safeguarding frameworks
- Provides an opportunity to strengthen/ review existing local safeguarding policies and procedures
- Should already be sharing family history of FGM with GP and health visitor

### **Safeguarding Considerations**

- Immediate family history of FGM -consider both parents
- Long term protective factors
- Circumstances and risk may change throughout childhood
- Good practice to discuss with the family but not need their consent to add information
- Document any conversation and actions taken in the girls notes





### **FGM-IS**

Discussion with parents:

- Explain that the indicator is to help protect their daughter(s)
- Not meant to stigmatise or penalise is a protective measure
- DO NOT need parents consent but if they raise objections discuss further with your Safeguarding lead as they may be trying to 'hide' their true feelings/'intent' to have their daughter(s) cut.





### **Adding an FGM Indicator**

- Indicator can only be added to a girl's record by a clinician who is directly caring for her(OR by an authorised administrator, adding the indicator at the request of the clinician).
- Clinicians not directly caring for a girl or the police/ social care can request an indicator is added if they are concerned about a girl
- e.g. Midwife can only add for the new-born girl not her siblings but can suggest GP does this

### What the wording on the system will look like to add an indicator (No indicator is set)

- *Title:* Female Genital Mutilation Information Sharing
- This FGM Information Sharing system would tell you if a family history of FGM has previously been shared for this patient to support safeguarding. She either has no family history or she might have a family history of FGM, but it has not been previously identified or has not yet been shared.
- If you identify a family history of FGM, ask appropriate questions and proceed to the next screen to share this information.

- REMEMBER: FGM is part of wider safeguarding considerations; if you have any safeguarding concerns including FGM, take appropriate action. If a girl u18 tells you she has <u>had</u> FGM or you see signs / symptoms which you believe means she has <u>had</u> FGM, report this to the police by calling 101.
- Button: 'Add FGM-IS Indicator'



### **FGM- IS 'indicator is set' screen**

- 'Alert Symbol' An FGM family history is recorded on this child's record; remember to consider safeguarding including FGM.
- Continue to deliver care to this child as planned, but be aware that she has a family history of FGM. Family history is known to be relevant when safeguarding against FGM.
- If you have any safeguarding concerns, including FGM, you should consider what action to take as part of your safeguarding responsibilities. The family were informed this information would be shared.

### FGM-IS 'Adding' Case Study

- At booking it was noted that a woman was subjected to FGM as a child in her country of origin. This is recorded in her notes.
- She gave birth to a girl.
- > **Outcome:** The Midwife:
- Carries out a safeguarding risk assessment
- Informs parents
- Adds the indicator to the girl's records



### FGM- IS Why View FGM - IS?



- Travel vaccinations
- Urinary tract infections
- Menstrual problems
- Immediate family history of FGM
- To see if 'alert' present/not present

Prompt to clinician to consider if girl at risk of FGM

### **FGM-IS** 'Viewing' case study


A family take their daughter to the GP for her immunisations. The family have strong cultural ties/are from a country where FGM is widely practised. They inform the nurse they are travelling for a holiday.

### Outcome:

- The nurse accesses the girl's electronic record
- The FGM indicator appears on the nurse's screen and prompts the nurse to ask more questions because of the potentially increased risk to the girl from travel.
