South East London Prescribing Support Dietetic Service

The Prescribing Support Dietetic service has been commissioned by SEL Medicines Optimisation. As part of the medicines optimisation agenda, the service has been set up to maximise the quality of patient care whilst optimising value in a safe and evidence-based way. This service is run by dietitians who will review prescriptions for oral nutritional supplements (ONS) and Cow's Milk Allergy. The dietitians will assess and provide individual nutrition care plans for patients to ensure that they are receiving the most appropriate prescription. This service aims to support all primary care clinicians in SEL to improve health outcomes for our patients.

The team aims to:

- Maximise the quality of care while optimising value in a safe and evidence-based way.
- Provide good quality dietetic care plans.
- Help ensure that prescriptions for adult oral nutritional supplements (ONS) and cow's milk allergy are clinically appropriate and cost effective.

The SEL PSD service has been commissioned to complete the work referenced, the service is independent and is not associated with any individual feed provider company, it would be encouraged that our service is utilised to support your practice in the appropriate management of ONS and hypoallergenic infant formulae prescriptions.

The national protocol and patient group direction for the administration of inactivated influenza vaccine to individuals in accordance with the national influenza vaccination programme were published on 1st September 2021.

British Menopause Society (BMS) further update on HRT supply shortages (20 July 2021)

BMS recognise that many women have been experiencing difficulties in obtaining HRT supplies with the ongoing HRT shortages. The burden of the COVID-19 pandemic on the health service and resulting difficulties in obtaining clinical appointments and accessing pharmaceutical services is likely to have added further to this situation.

The BMS have issued a further update on the current availability of HRT products to provide guidance to BMS members and clinical practitioners on HRT product availability. Prescribers should consider equivalent preparations to that which their patients are using. If an exact match is not possible, prescribers can seek guidance available on the BMS document on alternative HRT preparations and the practical prescribing chart on the BMS website and Menopause Matters website, to clarify equivalent doses. Consideration could also be given to prescribing estrogen and progestogen separately to make the closest match or find a suitable alternative. Different brands for the same medication may vary in appearance or excipients. However, they would provide equivalent amounts of hormones when used in similar doses. Signposting could also be provided to resources on the BMS website as well as Women's Health Concern (WHC) website, Menopause Matters and the Primary Care Women's Health Forum (PCWHF).

Action: The information on stock availability and supplies on the BMS website was obtained from the pharmaceutical companies manufacturing these products. Availability from wholesale supplier may lag behind and thus sometimes vary slightly from the information provided by the manufacturers. Therefore, practices are encouraged to work alongside community pharmacists on current stock availability.

SPS Medicines monitoring recommendations

The specialist pharmacy services (SPS) have created an interactive tool to summarise medicines monitoring recommendations for a range of medicines.

SEL Integrated Medicines Optimisation Committee (IMOC)

The following IMOC decisions / outputs have been ratified through SEL IMOC and SEL Medicines Optimisation sub-Committee Chair's action and can be accessed via the links: **NEW**:

- Methotrexate 10mg tablets Position statement and template letters.
- The paediatric formulary is now available via an app.
 To download the app, search for the "Paediatric Formulary" on the AppStore on iOS and Android.
- The adult RAGG list will be retired from the SEL IMOC website. The most up to date RAGG information for adult formulary medicines can be accessed via the SEL Joint Medicines Formulary website.
- Andexanet alfa following publication of a NICE technology appraisal, andexanet alfa has been included in the SEL Joint Medicines Formulary as a RED category medicine (hospital only).

UPDATED:

- Shared care guideline: Melatonin for treatment of sleep disorders in children and adolescents (age 1-17 years). The shared care guideline has been updated to incorporate the local prescribing guidance for melatonin in paediatric sleep disorders.
- Rheumatology treatment pathways and monitoring framework: The rheumatoid arthritis (RA) pathway has been updated to incorporate a recent NICE technology appraisal covering the use of adalimumab, etanercept and infliximab in moderate RA. The seronegative spondyloarthropathies (SpA) pathway has also been updated to incorporate 3 recently published NICE technology appraisals. The associated monitoring framework for these pathways has been refreshed and now includes a programme of rolling audits for the locally commissioned elements of the pathways.
- The review dates for the SEL Interface Policy and the Prescribing guide for the NHS/Private interface have been extended to March 2022.

SEL IMOC website is changing

The current IMOC resources are held on the old "Lambeth CCG" website. Pressures from the pandemic and vaccination programme have led to a delay in the move of all previous websites to the new SEL CCG website, including the SEL IMOC website. This month, the existing SEL IMOC website content will move to the SEL CCG website. This will result in a change to the links to SEL IMOC related guidance. Further detail on how to access SEL IMOC content on the new webpages will be provided once the website move is complete.
